Official introduction of Commissioner Linton Garner

Commissioner Doug Flook shared that the student representatives on council will be sworn in at their next meeting.

Elementary network meeting followed the Region 3 meeting. Minutes and agenda are not available. This meeting went well past 10 p.m. Many parents left before it ended.

Region 3 Parent's Committee Meeting #4 -- January 17th, 2013

CPC proposed budget 2012-2013 - approved

Consultation: Policy on "Employment and Assignment of Relatives" – Commissioner Flook shared that some of the recommendations in this policy go against the teacher's collective agreement. The teacher's union will be meeting with the LBPSB. Note that we may be the first school board in Quebec to adopt a policy regarding this. Region 3 CPC agree that spirit of the policy is a good one, but that the language and implications need to be worked on. This is a second draft of this policy that has changed significantly from the first version.

Consultation: Budget Consultation 2013-2014 – LBPSB believes in an open budgetary process where stakeholders have the right to suggest orientations and priorities so as to benefit the system as a whole. We need to keep in mind the following criteria:

The budgetary process must:

- Provide an equitable allocation of resources
- Be in keeping with the resources available
- Maximize the distribution of resources to educational institutions
- Ensure the sound management of results.

We tabled this item in order to research the topic and come back to our next meeting with suggestions.

2012

New Business: Midterm exams. Why don't all schools hold them at the same time and why are they not all the same exam? Director David Meloche explained that unlike provincial exams, these exams reflect the different teaching methods and philosophies at each school.

Parental Issues: School's cleanliness. A member wondered how LBPSB school would fair during 'random cleanliness spot-checks'. Director David Meloche explained in detail the way LBPSB custodial services operate. We do our own inspections and reports.

Notes of interest: The Rona Kupac Fund (part of the Pearson Educational Fund) has money available for LBPSB families in need to purchase warm winter clothing.
