1.1 Call to Order & Welcome

Having attained quorum, the meeting was called to order by Principal T. Di Vittori at 7:04pm. T. Di Vittori welcomed all those in attendance. He asked that points 1.4.1, 1.4.2 and 1.4.3 on the agenda be moved to follow point 1.1.

1.2 Adoption of the Agenda

13-14-01It was moved by N. Montcalm to adopt the agenda with the change of moving points 1.4.1, 1.4.2
and 1.4.3 to follow 1.2. The motion was seconded by D. Poirier, and was carried unanimously.

1.4.1 GB Chair

13-14-02 S. Gesualdi nominated B. Pande to be GB Chair. The motion was seconded by M. Vallée.
B. Pande accepted the nomination to be GB Chair. There were no other nominations. The vote for Balgovind Pande as Chair was carried unanimously.

1.4.2 GB Secretary

B. Pande nominated S. Gesualdi to be GB Secretary. S. Gesualdi accepted the position of GB Secretary.

1.4.3 GB Vice-Chair

B. Pande nominated S. Gesualdi to be GB Vice-Chair.

13-14-03 M. Vallée proposed that S. Gesualdi be GB vice-chair. There were no other nominations. The motion was seconded by N. Montcalm and was carried unanimously. S. Gesualdi accepted the position of GB Vice-Chair.

1.3 Adoption of Minutes of June 12th, 2013.

13-14-04 It was moved by L. Sulano to accept the minutes. The motion was seconded by M. Vallée, and was carried unanimously.

1.4 New Business

1.4.4 GB Internal Rules of Management (info)

B. Pande pointed out that "Conflict of Interest" article (from the Education Act, Art. 70) was added to the document.

13-14-05 It was moved by R. Ethier to approve the inclusion of the Conflict of Interest article to the GB Internal Rules of Management. The motion was seconded by N. Montcalm and was carried unanimously.

1.4.5 Daycare Parents' Committee

No individuals have approached the daycare coordinator in regards to forming a Daycare Parents' Committee. It is known that should anyone have a question that they should approach anyone on the Governing Board.

13-14-06 It was moved by B. Bagshaw that a Daycare Parents' Committee will not be formed for the school year 2013/14. The motion was seconded by R. Ethier and was carried unanimously.

1.4.6 Community Representatives

Principal Di Vittori will approach Rev. Scott and Gloria Coulter to be the GB Community Reps for the school year 2013/14.

1.4.7 Commissioners' Invite to GB Meetings

13-14-07 It was proposed by D. Poirier that Commissioner L. Garner have a standing invitation to the GB meetings for the school year 2013/14. The motion was seconded by M. Vallée and carried unanimously.

1.4.8 H&S Liaison

This will be tabled at the next meeting. In regards to H&S: S.Gesualdi mentioned that the Shindig & Silent Auction (held Oct 3rd) raised a little over \$10,000. A request to the H&S to forward an exact gross total has yet to be answered.

1.4.9 GB Income Statement (2014-14)

Last year's budget was \$721. The balance at the end of the year was \$421, which will get clawed-back. This year's budget is close to \$300.

13-14-08 It was moved by M. Valle to accept the 2012-13 income statement. The motion was seconded by N. Montcalm and was carried unanimously.

1.4.10 Ratification of Approvals Via E-mail (Culture in Schools Grant – Field Trips)

- a) Grade 3 students going to Pointe Claire Library to meet a children's author.
- b) Grade 5 students going to visit Pointe Claire Village and Stewart Hall
- 13-14-09 R. Ethier proposed ratification to approve these two fieldtrips. The motion was seconded by L. Sulano and carried unanimously.

1.4.11 Field Trips (within walking distance)

Blanket permission from the GB is given for walking trips within 1.6km of the school. Parents still have to sign a consent form for each outing of this nature.

13-14-10 It was moved by L. Sulano to approve the blanket permission for walking distance field trips. The motion was seconded by B. Bagshaw and carried unanimously.

1.4.12 Field Trips

- a) Cycle 3 will go to Abraska in Rigaud on October 17 (gr.5) and October 18 (gr.6). The ratio will be 1:9 (not including the site supervisors). Cost \$34 (gr.5) and \$36 (gr.6) Change in cost is due to the grade 6 students will be involved in an activity using GPS navigational tools which is an extra fee.
- b) Two students will go to the Peace Summit on October 17th. These students are chosen from the Social Action Committee. The spiritual advisor will be accompanying the students. No cost.

- c) As part of Social Action Team, 12 students and 3 adults will attend the Free the Children -We Day at theatre St. Denis on November 25th. No cost. Bussing will be paid by the school.
- d) On March 27th, Grade 4 students will be visited by animators enacting the way of life in Nouvelle France. Cost \$5/student.
- e) Cycle 2 (grades 3&4) Ski Club (Phys Ed) at Mt. Habitant with Rod Roy Ski School. 2 days in January and 2 days in February. Ratio 1:10 off the hill. 1:5 on the hill. Cost \$168 \$195. Equipment rental for all four days \$36.
- f) Grade 5 Canoeing. They will walk to the Pointe Claire Canoe Club. Cost \$15/student.
- 13-14-11 It was moved by M. Vallée to approve of all six field trips presented. The motion was seconded by R. Ethier and carried unanimously.

1.5.3 Teachers' Report

- Positive atmosphere in the school.
- Terry Fox Run: kids and staff involved. The students created teams and had a lot of fun.
- Media Tech Program: Off to a good start.

1.5.4 Library Report

- o Many volunteers.
- D. Poirier is working on a project involving 4 or 5 authors coming to Montreal for four days to tour different schools; to take place the week of April 6th. The cost is \$270 per reading per author (they are able to do three readings per day). Looking for support from the PEF to help fund the project. This would give disadvantaged schools the opportunity to host an author. Also involved would be EMSB, LBPSB, The Study, Queen of Angels and Miss Edgar and Miss Cramps School. The project would also include a presentation for adults.

1.5.5 Daycare Report

- A decrease in daycare enrollment: from 174 to 158.
- September 20th ped day: students made their own pizza (and ate it for lunch). They also made stained glass frames and did a robotics activity in which they assembled little machines (cars) and got them to move.

- October 4th the students enjoyed a Mad Science activity. This involved a workshop on chemical reactions and they enjoyed a 'glow show'. In another workshop they made chocolate creations.
- Pizza and Subway lunches are offered again this year. This is not a fund-raiser nor a "for profit" activity but rather a service offered to parents. A return to Subway and a trial with Domino's Pizza. S. Gesualdi mentioned that the Dagwoods owner inquired as to why the contract for Dagwoods was not renewed. It was recommended that a letter be sent out of courtesy to Dagwoods to explain (reason for change being "create variety").
- Considering that the grade 6 students have a field trip on October 18th to Abraska, the pizza lunch for them will be offered Monday October 21st.
